Sugar Land Legacy Foundation Launches Brick Paver Engraving Project in Honor of Local Veterans

Sugar Land, TX – The Sugar Land Legacy Foundation recently launched a fundraising campaign honoring local veterans.

A limited supply of 100 “Honor or Remember” brick pavers is available for \$250 each. The brick pavers may be engraved with text such as a veteran’s name, branch of the military and dates of service. Funds raised will support future memorialization projects at Sugar Land Memorial Park.

The City of Sugar Land Parks and Recreation Department recently installed an Honor and Remember Flag adjacent to the current Veterans Memorial at Sugar Land Memorial Park. The 4” x 8” brick pavers will surround the flag.

Sugar Land Legacy Foundation President Sunil Sharma recently announced that State Rep. Rick Miller and City of Sugar Land Mayor James Thompson pledged donations for the first “Honor or Remember” bricks.

Additionally, City of Sugar Land City Council Members Himesh Gandhi, Joe Zimmerman, Amy Mitchell, Bridget Yeung and Harish Jajoo, as well as City of Sugar Land City Manager Allen Bogard and Sugar Land Legacy Foundation Board President Sunil Sharma have all pledged support toward purchasing a brick paver.
